



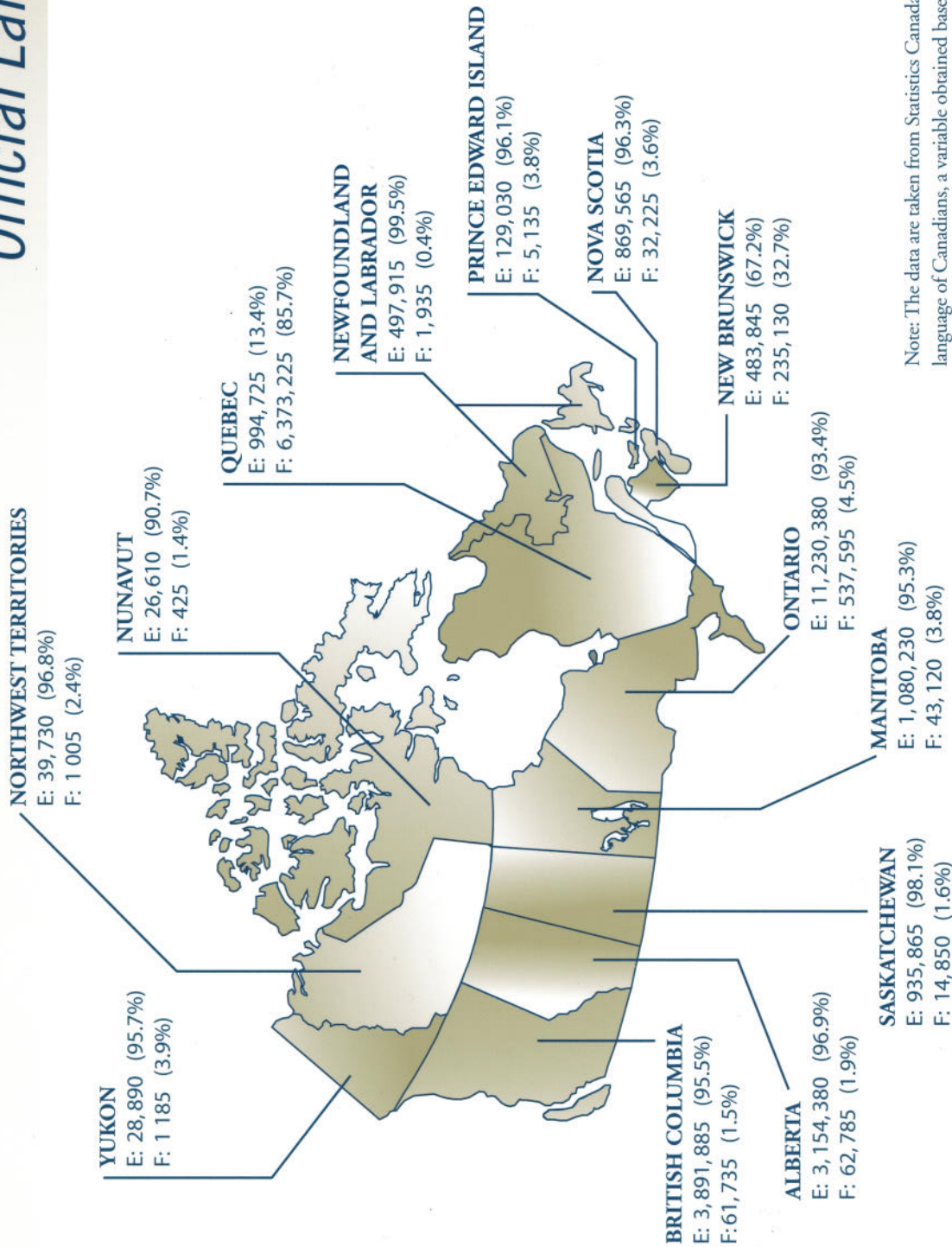

Note: The data are taken from Statistics Canada's 2006 Census of Population and are on the first official language of Canadians, a variable obtained based on responses to census questions regarding knowledge of both official languages, mother tongue and home language.

In the English and French groups, a further breakdown was done of the people who speak English and French and who indicated both official languages as mother tongues and home languages.

The total of the English-speaking and French-speaking populations is not equal to the total population, as some people's first official language is neither English nor French.
